

Tips for transferring to UW-Madison

TO MAJOR IN: INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

Below we list course recommendations for current Madison College students intending to transfer to UW-Madison to major in International Studies.

GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS (Intended for students who matriculated Fall2007 or later) Taking these courses before you transfer to UW-Madison will save you time...

Take your Communication A (Comm-A). Madison College course options include: ENGLISH (801): 201, 205 & 206 or SPEECH (810): 201.

Take your Quantitative Reasoning A (QR-A). Madison College course options include: MATH (804): 195, 197, 210, 211, 212, 228, 229, or SOCSCI (809): 264.

Take other courses in humanities, literature, ethnic studies, foreign language or physical sciences. These classes are College of Letters & Science breadth requirements and will be helpful even if you decide not to major in International Studies. Note: The International Studies major satisfies students' QR-B for the BA or BS degree. For more information on college breadth requirements, refer to <u>BABS2007</u>.

Classes to take at MATC:

Take Economics 101 [SOCSCI (809) 143 or SOCSCI (809) 212]. Econ 101 is a pre-requisite to declaring the International Studies Major. Students need a 2.0 GPA or higher in order to declare the International Studies Major. **This class will also count as your QR-B general education requirement.**

Take Economics 102 [SOCSCI (809) 211]. Econ 102 is a pre-requisite to declaring the International Studies Major. Students need a 2.0 GPA or higher in order to declare the International Studies Major.

We recommend students start taking their Language Sequence at Madison College. The International Studies Major requires student to have 5th semester proficiency in a Foreign Language. That is, 5 semesters in the SAME language at the college level (high school credits do not count; 2 semesters of Spanish and 3 semesters of Russian do not count). Students can start their language sequence at MATC by selecting the intended language, taking the appropriate placement test, and enrolling. Example: MATC FLANG (802) 212 = UW-Madison Spanish 102
